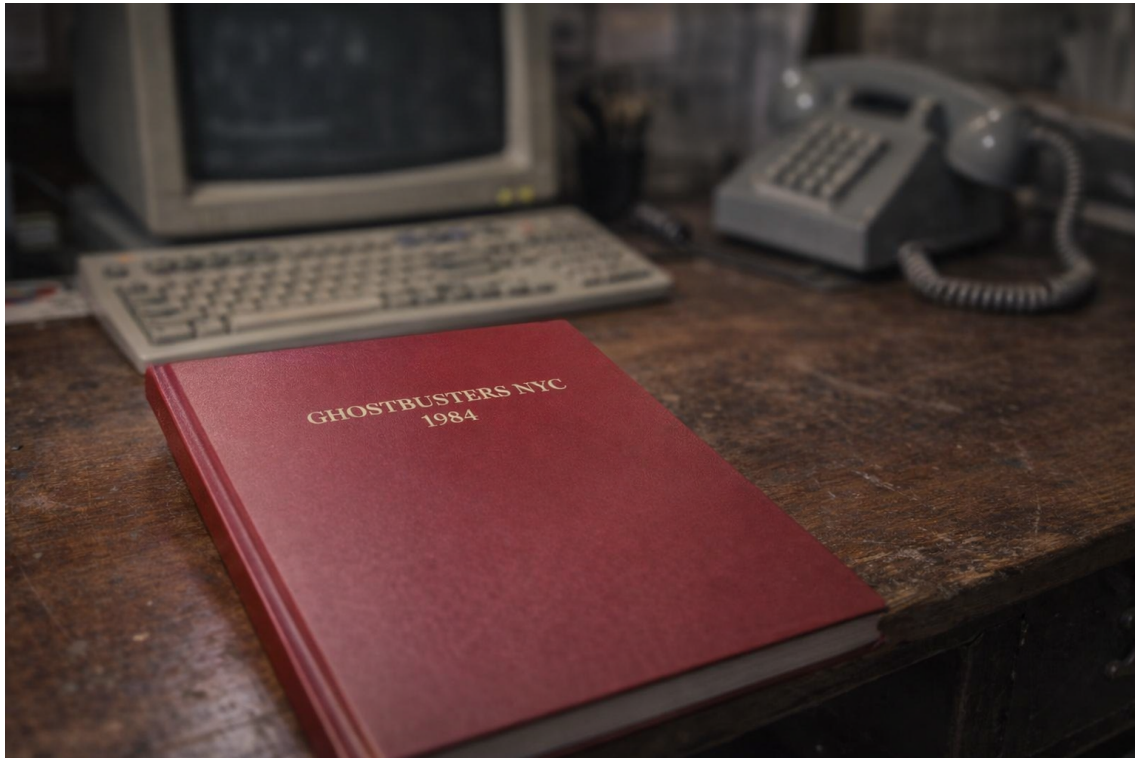




Ghostbusters 1984 Field Diary

The Ghostbusters 1984 Field Diary is a primary historical artefact documenting the earliest days of Ghostbusters operations in New York City. Compiled during the team's formative period, the diary serves as a combined research log, incident report, and personal record of unprecedented paranormal activity.

Purpose and Origins

The diary was first assembled in 1984 as the Ghostbusters transitioned from academic parapsychology into active field investigation. With no established framework for dealing with large-scale hauntings, the team relied on handwritten notes, sketches, and observations recorded in a single working document.

Rather than a formal report, the diary reflects real-time problem solving. Entries range from scientific measurements and equipment tests to hurried field notes taken during live encounters.

Contents of the Diary

The diary contains a wide variety of material, including:

- First-contact reports with newly encountered entities
- Handwritten containment attempts and failures
- Sketches of ghosts, symbols, and equipment configurations
- Personal observations and informal commentary
- Early ghost classification experiments

Some pages show signs of damage, including scorch marks, ectoplasmic residue stains, and hurried corrections, suggesting they were written under extreme conditions.

Scientific and Historical Value

The 1984 diary is considered invaluable due to its raw and unfiltered nature. Unlike later, standardised Ghostbusters documentation, the diary captures moments before procedures were refined or safety protocols established.

Several modern ghost classification systems and containment strategies can be traced back to early theories and notes first recorded in this diary.

Personal Nature of the Entries

Beyond technical data, the diary also reflects the personalities of the original Ghostbusters. Some entries include humour, frustration, doubt, and moments of genuine concern as the scale of paranormal activity became clear.

This blend of science and personality provides rare insight into how the team adapted psychologically as well as professionally to their new role.

Ongoing Use and Additions

Although originating in 1984, the diary was never considered a finished document. Pages were added, annotated, and cross-referenced as new entities were encountered.

In later years, the diary evolved into a reference archive, used to compare new manifestations against early case studies. Some sections were deliberately left blank, intended for future entries as paranormal activity continued.
